### ENSENADA TUNE-UP AND NEWPORT-TO-ENSENADA

The 25<sup>th</sup> Ensenada Tune-Up Race had 33 entries in 2019 and represents a high water mark for this race event. We typically have around 25 boats that use this race as an opportunity to fine tune their vessels for the 125 mile Newport-to-Ensenada race.

Clive and Martha Gurwitz's 42-foot trawler, "Molokai Girl" hosted 15 race committee members for this ocean start off the Balboa Pier. Some of us are still a little deaf in one ear due to our proximity to the cannon being fired at each of the five starts. We had to add a fifth start due to the number of entries. South Shore Yacht Club had 3 boats entered in PHRF C: Don Albrecht, "Valkyrie", Brian Boyle, "Tui" and Chris Bliss, "Legato". Don Albrecht and the crew aboard "Valkyrie" scored a third place finish! #### 2019 TRANSPAC

The first Transpac race from the West Coast to Waikiki occurred in 1906 with just three entries. This race event takes place every two years and typically has 50-60 entries. 2019 represents the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Transpac Race. This fact has not been lost on the record number of entries which currently stands at 107 entries!

South Shore Yacht Club has two boats registered for the 2019 Transpac race. The first boat is owned and skippered by Mark and Kathy Ashmore. "Nalu V" is a Cal-40, built in 1968, Hull # 133 and the Transpac race represents the first leg of what will be a two year odyssey. After arriving on Oahu, the crew of five will continue on to Tahiti and other islands in the South Pacific! Mark Ashmore is semi-retired from the family-owned optical shop that has been in Pasadena for four generations, roughly 78 years. Their son will run the business while they're away.

## RBOC CALL TO ACTION - MAY 9 & 10 NEWPORT BEACH COPPER WORKSHOPS

RBOC is urging Orange County boaters to attend one or both public workshops on Thursday, May 9, 5:30-7:30 at Marina Park and Friday, May 10, 11:30-1:30 at Newport Beach Central Library in Newport Beach and to provide comments to prevent new copper reduction programs that will mandate boat paint conversions, hull cleaning best management practices, hull cleaning certification programs and education programs.

RBOC needs a show of force in large attendance to get the message across to the Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board that new laws aren't needed. If approved and implemented, bottom painting of boats in Newport Beach could cost close to \$15,000 and will last less than a year.
