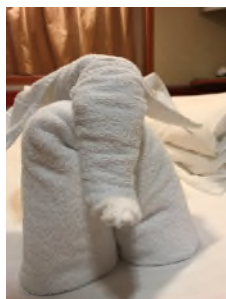
Commodore's Comments by Dean Russell

Our first stop was at a creamery, Los Globos, for cheese tasting with red wine. Unlimited samples of cheese were offered freshly cut from 12" rounds and there were a lot of rounds. What an experience.

The Guadalupe valley has some 200 wineries. We were able to visit three. The first was Santo Tomas, a very old and large winery that held a concert with 11,000 attendees the night before.



The second was Casa Frida. Frida was a famous Mexican artist and pictures of her and some of her art was displayed. There we were also able to have a Tequila tasting. Good stuff and it was a good thing that we were not driving.



We all had a great time. If this type of cruise is appealing to you, mention it to the 2019 Cruise Director.



The third was Decantos Vinicola which was at the end of a dirt road. It is a beautiful and very modern winery with expansive views of the valley. There was also a first class restaurant in the winery. We had lunch there and shared a variety of specially prepared dishes, of course paired with wine.

UPDATE: NEWPORT SEA BASE USES SOUTH SHORE YACHT CLUB DONATION TO UPGRADE RACING SLOOP



STUDENT DRIVER, a Columbia 30' Racing Sloop is an addition to the NEWPORT SEA BASE (NSB) Advanced Sailing Program. This yacht is being refitted and upgraded with the \$8,000 raised by the South Shore Yacht Club fundraising efforts last Spring. STUDENT DRIVER is now an integral part of the Advanced Sailing program at the NSB allowing young sailors to experience a significant ocean-going racing yacht after they have advanced through a progression of training sailboats and larger keelboats that the SSYC fundraisers helped purchase or update over the past 10 years. While the STUDENT DRIVER has been hauled out for repairs and upgrades, new sails have been purchased, upgraded equipment ordered and the oxidized hull has been returned to its original color and condition (see the before and after pictures). The young sailors and staff at the Newport Sea Base are very thankful for the 10 years of support provided by the South Shore Yacht Club. They say," THANK YOU!"

Jim would respond so everyone could hear him, "Here's a hundred dollars! Give the rest to the Race Committee!" That would be the cue for Steve Baker to chime in, "On behalf of the Race Committee, we gladly accept your donation!"

One night after a 2nd Friday of the Month dinner, a few of us went to a bar to audition a band for The Border Run. Jim got up at one point with his 3-legged cane, we thought he was excusing himself to use the restroom. But, he managed to work himself onto the dance floor to dance with some fine-looking women! That's when all the cell phones came out to capture the moment with this 83-year-old man dancing with the young lovelies! Sadly, Jim White passed away and all the SSYC Board of Directors attended his funeral service in our winter yacht club uniforms. Shortly thereafter, we changed the name of SSYC's Winter Hibachi Series to the Jim White Memorial Winter Series in his honor. We hope you'll honor Jim White's memory by participating in the Jim White Memorial Winter Series coming soon in 2019!
