Cruise by Martha Gurwitz

The 28th of February was a beautiful, spring-like day with gorgeous blue skies. The gusty winds that were predicted to ruin our day never happened. Maybe these winds did some damage in the beginning of the day, but by the time we set out on Molokai Girl and Shindig, the sea was calm and causing no problem at all.

So, off we went in search of dolphins and whales. Tom Noto did a terrific job aboard Molokai Girl shouting directions to our Captain Clive, letting him know where to go. And, boy, did we see a lot of dolphins and bubbles from the blowhole of the whales. Thanks Tom for being such a terrific navigator.



When we spotted our featured guests, everyone jumped up with joy shouting dolphins, dolphins and the cameras were clicking away. We got some really awesome shots from the top deck and the front of the boat and some really terrific videos. The dolphins were jumping in pairs of two or more and swimming all around the boat. I have a great video of the dolphins swimming in front of the boat as if they were leading the way.

By the end of February, the migration of the gray whales goes from the south, Mexico, to the north, as they head back to Alaska. This species undertakes the longest migration of any mammal on planet Earth! Gray Whales only thrive on the west coast of the North American continent, so California is one of just a handful of whale watching locations where you can see this unique species. The weather between San Diego and Los Angeles is much more favorable at this time of year than anywhere else in California.

This is also an excellent time of year for dolphin watching. Large pods of COMMON DOLPHIN can be witnessed year round and often steal the show as they frolic in pods averaging 100-200 individuals. Inshore, BOTTLE-NOSE DOLPHIN are frequently witnessed along the

route taken by the Gray Whales as both species favor near coastal waters. This is the best time of year to observe the stunning beauty of the PACIFIC WHITE SIDED DOLPHIN, which we rarely encounter outside of the winter months.

Fin Whales, Humpback Whales, and Minke Whales are also potential sightings this time of year along with sporadic sightings of Risso's Dolphin and Orca.

Along the way we kept checking in with Shindig, who always stayed within view, and helped each other navigate a better path to enable us to see more. We must have all been doing a good job because it seemed as if the commercial whale watching boats were following us!

After about 4 hours at sea, it was time to head home. Clive let Tom and I do a bit of the driving while he took a little rest. It's not so easy to stand for 4 hours while driving a 42 foot trawler! So, we headed for the harbor entrance meeting up again with Shindig and the opportunity to get some great shots of both vessels. As we entered the channel of the harbor we spotted an absolutely beautiful sailboat. It turned out to be the Windward Passage. It was originally a ketch that won the Transpac race from San Pedro to Honolulu in 1971. She was then made into a sloop. She sailed the course in 9 days, 9 hours and 6 minutes, breaking the old record by 75 minutes set by the ketch Blackfin in 1969. It was such an amazing sight. Shindig actually turned around in the harbor to get a really good look at it!

We also saw the amazing Schooner Lively with it's beautiful red sails going in the opposite direction as us, out to sea.

All in all it was a super fantastic day that was enjoyed by all. We look forward to all the exciting events we have planned for 2021. Come out and join us!

February 27th saw two more Jim White Memorial Winter Series Races 5 and 6. It turned out to be yet another beautiful day on the water. We had one issue in that Newport Harbor Yacht Club's Race Committee boat set up their start/finish line about 50 yards away from our starting area, so it became a little congested with boats sailing a variety of different directions. Our last two races are scheduled for Saturday, March 27th, but we may do an Amendment to the Sailing Instructions to move the race to Sunday, March 28th so that we may have the entire basin to ourselves once again.

I'm showing the results of Race # 5 below just to emphasize how important it is to score the race with the proper time. You will notice that Valhalla III corrected over Radical Departure by ONE SECOND to take first place after sailing a 3.7 mile course! We'll see you on the water.

Commodore's Cruise by Dean Russell

2021 COMMODORE'S CRUISE IN THE U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS

Commodore Haro is inviting you to join his cruise in the USVI departing from St Thomas on October 25, 2021 for seven nights. This is undoubtedly one of the most fabulous cruising waters in the world. This cruise was originally planned for the British Virgin Islands. We had three boats chartered for that cruise. Unfortunately, COVID 19 scuttled that cruise and the BVI is still closed to visitors.

Cruising from St Thomas will be better and easier than cruising from Tortolla. The best air fare and airline schedules are to St Thomas. We will also avoid having to transfer from St Thomas to Tortolla, where the BVI charter bases are. If the BVI reopens, we will be able to cruise the BVI Islands also. Virgin Gorda, the most northern island where the Baths are located is only 30NM from St Thomas. All of the islands are relatively close and we can visit Norman, Peter, Salt and Ginger in between. The itinerary is ours to choose since we are the captains and crew.

The ships that we are chartering are 40' catamarans. Each will have four cabins and four heads that will comfortably accommodate eight passengers. The cost for the boats will be about \$900 per person (not including airfare, food and miscellaneous expenses).



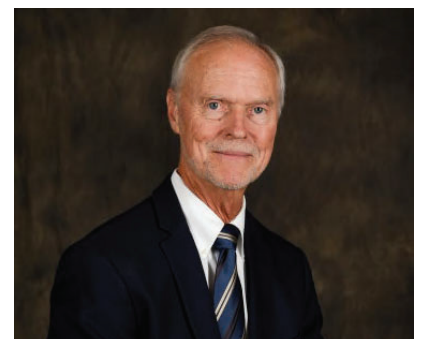
To reserve, send a \$500 deposit to Dean Russell, PO Box 1075, Lake Arrowhead CA 92352. This is refundable until you select a boat to be on. After that, the deposit is non-refundable.

The deadline for making a reservation is April 30, 2021.

For those who reserved for the 2020 BVI cruise, you have \$150pp credit that will be applied to the final cost of the boat.
