As your South Shore Yacht Club Vice-Commodore, it is one of my duties to oversee the activities of the junior sailing program. Although, SSYC does not have a formal youth sailing program, we generously contribute monetarily to youth sailing programs in support of the Sea Scouts at Newport Sea Base. We strongly encourage our club's youth to get involved in the Sea Scouts as they have amazing programs for your youth.

I am highlighting this very worthwhile program in this issue of *The Sheets* to keep you, our members, informed about our alternative junior sailing program.

The Sea Scouts are associated with Boy Scouts of America and are divided into two age groups at Newport Sea Base: "Junior Sea Scouts" for ages 11-13 and "Sea Scouts" for ages 14-20. Junior Sea Scouts learn fundamentals of boating in four individual semester classes, and acquire knowledge, skills, and experience in subjects such as vessel types (paddle, sail & motor) and how to handle vessels in a safe manner. The Junior Sea Scouts interact and build friendships with older Sea Scouts.

The older Sea Scouts are assigned in groups or units called Ships and focus on sailing and cruising on sail or power boats. These Sea Scouts learn to operate and maintain their watercraft while always ensuring safety. They learn leadership skills on the water as they navigate and guide their vessels into winds and tides. These youth share their experiences with fellow scouts to become better helmsmen, navigators, and sail handlers.

The Newport Sea Base's early beginnings came out of public support in 1937 when the Boy Scouts of America, Orange County Council signed the initial 25-year lease for the property. The Newport Sea Base and the Sea Scouts have gone through many developments since its origination. In 1947, funds were collected to build the first facility that included a clubhouse with restrooms and showers. By 1961, the number of youths utilizing the facility daily increased to over 2,100 per year and by 1969 soared to 12,000.

New buildings and programs were developed, with most still existing today. The old facility was showing its age and was torn down in 1979, but a new facility was dedicated by the end of 1980. The facility was once again modernized in 2002, by an over \$7M expansion project that provided for a contemporary education and aquatics center. The facility now has a modern conference center, library, classrooms and crew center with picnic area and boating equipment with over 15,000 youth in attendance each year.

Programs include Weekend and Summer Youth Schedules that are available in both morning and afternoon sessions, in single and multi-day courses for ages 11 to 17 at economical prices. Other programs include courses in Health & Safety, Junior Racing and Sea Scouts, and Scout Merit Badges.

Newport Sea Base has boat rentals and boats 4 Sail (For Sale). All proceeds go to Newport Sea Base to support an extraordinary level of boating and aquatic education and experiences for girls and boys.

Newport Sea Base generously takes gift donations in the form of cash, stocks, estates, and real estate with all contributions going to youth boating and aquatics education and resources such as classroom facilities, technology, and training programs.

THE SSYC/DPYC ENSENADA TUNE-UP RACE

The Ensenada Tune-Up Race was held on Saturday, April 10th. We had 29 entries which represents a high water mark for this annual race event. Mike and Penny Nelson's trawler, *Shindig*, was again pressed into service as SSYC's Race Committee Start boat. The Race Committee was comprised of eleven South Shore Yacht Club members. Staff Commodore Dean Russell volunteered to fire the cannon off the bow of *Shindig* half a dozen times. He's still waiting to get his hearing back! The Race Committee members were Mike and Penny Nelson, John and Robin Marshall, Dean and Barbara Russell, Lynn and Chris Tadlock, Scott and Kate Pearson and Lisa Cullinane. The Race Committee performed five 5-minute rolling start sequences flawlessly!

SSYC had three entries in the Ensenada Tune-Up Race. This is the 14.2 mile course starting off the Balboa Pier and finishing just off Dana Point. SSYC member Chris Bliss was sailing *Legato* to a 3rd Place finish in the PHRF Class C. Congratulations Chris and the crew of *Legato*! SSYC member John Hanscom and the crew of *Silk* finished in 4th place in PHRF D class, followed by Don Albrecht and the crew of *Valkyrie* in 5th place.

NEWPORT-TO-ENSENADA RACE EVENT-APRIL 23-25

SSYC's Border Run Race Event has been folded into the N2E International Race Event to offer multiple courses for sailors to choose, i.e. Ensenada, San Diego and Dana Point. This race is always scheduled to be on the last full weekend in April. Once again, SSYC was called upon to be the Inshore Race Committee boat on the starting line. Mike Nelson rose to the occasion and called upon me and SSYC Staff Commodore Tina Simmons to assist as crew. The Newport Ocean Sailing Association (NOSA) provided the race committee members to run the race starting sequences.

Wind conditions were good at 10-11 knots at the start. South Shore Yacht Club had three entries on the Newport-to-Ensenada course. Erik Waelput sailed *Brown Eyed Girl* in the PHRF A Class with an elapsed time of 21 hours, 46 minutes and 58 seconds. Mark Ashmore raced his Cal 40, *Nalu V*, to a 4th place finish in the PHRF C Class with an elapsed time of 26 hours, 21 minutes and 59 seconds. Brian Boyle raced *Tui* to an incredible 2nd place finish in the PHRF D Class in an elapsed time of 28 hours, 53 minutes and 10 seconds. It was one of our best showings in years!
