CREW OF 2 AROUND CATALINA – JULY 10-11

South Shore Yacht Club's signature race is known far and wide in the yachting community. The Crew of 2 Around Catalina has been run by SSYC for over 60 years! This is the premier event for double-handed racers in which you're limited to just two people on board as co-skippers.

There are two courses to choose from: The 90nm Around Catalina course and the 63nm Around Ship Rock (Two Harbors) course. We typically need about 25 SSYC members to pull off a regatta of this size. We have to staff the race committee boat and need folks to record the finish times on the Balboa Pier from 8:00 PM Saturday night to 5:00 PM on Sunday afternoon, or until all the boats have finished or retired from the race. Each year, we contact Grace Leung, Manager for the City of Newport Beach, to ask her to leave the gate open to the Balboa Pier all night long to permit our Race Committee teams to come and go to the end of the pier.
